

Privacy Policy

Trigpoint Adventures holds some information about you. This document outlines how that information is used, who we may share that information with and how we keep it secure. This notice does not provide exhaustive detail. However, we are happy to provide any additional information or explanation needed. Any requests for this should be sent to trigpointadventures@gmail.com. We keep this Privacy Notice under regular review. This Privacy Notice was last reviewed in August 2022.

1. How We Obtain Your Personal Data

Information provided by you

You provide us with personal data in the following ways:

- By completing a course booking form
- By completing a medical and consent form
- Through email, over the telephone or by post
- By taking credit card and online payment

This may include the following information:

- Basic details such as name, address, contact details and next of kin
- Details of contact we have had with you such as hiking/guiding/course requests
- Health information including your previous medical history and medication
- Bank details
- Photographs

Information we get from other sources

- Through online booking platforms such as AirBnB and Eventbrite
- Through Mountain Training via the Candidate Management System (CMS)
- Through the activity leader taking photographs

We use this information in order to process your booking and to maintain your welfare whilst on the mountains. This means that the legal basis of our holding your personal data is for legitimate interest.

2. How long do you hold confidential information for?

Following completion of your attendance to a Trigpoint Adventures activity we retain your personal data for the period defined by our insurance provider i.e. 3 years, the maximum period where a liability claim can be made. This enables us to process any complaint you may make. In this case the legal basis of our holding your personal data is for contract administration.

On this basis all records held by Trigpoint Adventures for **adults** are kept for 3 years from the date of the last attendance and then destroyed. If a client is under 18, records will be kept until their 21st birthday.



3. How we use your personal data

We act as a data controller for use of your personal data to process your booking for the Trigpoint Adventures activity. This includes processing of your data from third parties such as AirBnB, Eventbrite, Mountain Training, credit card and online payments.

We undertake at all times to protect your personal data, including any health and contact details, in accordance with requirements of the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) concerning data protection. We will also take reasonable security measures to protect your personal data storage.

Health information where appropriate (eg use of an Epipen) will be used by Mountain Leaders and their assistants involved in the event you are booked onto.

Photographs taken during the activity may be used for marketing purposes and shared on Trigpoint Adventures social media platforms including Facebook, Instagram and Twitter.

4. Do you share my information with other organisations?

We will keep information about you confidential. We will only disclose your information with other third parties with your express consent with the exception of the following third parties:

- Mountain Training CMS for processing Hill and Mountain Skills Course bookings
- Our insurance company, for the processing of a complaint made by you

5. What are your rights?

Every individual has the right to see, amend, delete or have a copy, of data held that can identify you, with some exceptions (listed on the <u>ICO website</u>). You do not need to give a reason to see your data.

If you want to access your data you must make a subject access request in writing to <u>trigpointadventures@gmail.com</u>. Under special circumstances, some information may be withheld (listed on the <u>ICO_website</u>). We shall respond within 20 working days from the point of receiving the request and all necessary information from you. Our response will include the details of the personal data we hold on you including:

- Sources from which we acquired the information
- The purposes of processing the information
- Persons or entities with whom we are sharing the information

You have the right, subject to exemptions (listed on the <u>ICO_website</u>), to ask to:

- Have your information deleted
- Have your information corrected or updated where it is no longer accurate
- Ask us to stop processing information about you where we are not required to do so by law or in accordance with the BANT and CNHC guidelines.
- Receive a copy of your personal data, which you have provided to us, in a structured, commonly used readable format and have the right to transmit that data to another controller, without hindrance from us.
- Object at any time to the processing of personal data concerning you



We do not carry out any automated processing, which may lead to automated decision based on your personal data.

6. What safeguards are in place to ensure data that identifies me is secure?

We only use information that may identify you in accordance with GDPR. This requires us to process personal data only if there is a legitimate basis for doing so and that any processing must be fair and lawful.

We also ensure the information we hold is kept in secure locations, restrict access to information to authorised personnel only, protect personal and confidential information held on equipment such as laptops with encryption (which masks data so that unauthorised users cannot see or make sense of it). We ensure external data processors that support us, are legally and contractually bound to operate and prove security arrangements are in place where data that could or does identify a person are processed.

Trigpoint Adventures is registered with the Information Commissioner's Office (ICO) as a data controller and collects data for a variety of purposes. A copy of the registration is available through the ICO website (search by business name).

7. Website on-line technical details

- a. Forms these are used on our website making use of an available 'forms module' which has a number of built-in features to help ensure privacy. The website is secured through a security certificate which encrypts all data processed through it.
- b. We do not make use of cookies to collect any private or personally identifiable information. The technical platform of this website uses cookies solely to aid the proper technical functioning of the website – which in no way collects or discloses any personal information about you as a visitor.
